INTERNATIONAL TRAINING - LOCAL STRATEGIES AND ACTION PLANS FOR SOCIAL INCLUSION

A group of 15 people from Poland, Hungary, Germany, Denmark and Italy met in Palermo to implement the 2nd international training of the project called "Local Strategies and Action Plans for Social Inclusion".

The training focused on learning how to create a first draft of a strategic document that partners can present and negotiate in the future with other local partners and institutions.

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Includate identifies the need for capacity building to enable migrant associations to be involved in inclusion and diversity strategies, starting with a careful analysis of the needs of the communities involved.

Communication and cooperation between municipalities, residents with a migration background and migrant associations require intercultural skills and specific methods from both public policy-making bodies and association actors.

Thus, by combining municipal community actors and migrants from different national contexts and cities of different sizes, the project shapes a broad spectrum of knowledge, experience and perspectives to identify a strategy for strengthening inclusion and diversity in European cities.









As part of the training, the group took part in a migrant tour called "Through my eyes", organised by Moltivolti.

Through the use of tools and methodologies such as community mapping, community reporting and storytelling, as presented in the previous newsletter, the consortium collected the lived stories of residents with migrant backgrounds and worked on presenting the themes and issues addressed by the participants to stakeholders on the local, national, and European Level.
